Around the Fellowship

Well done to all the young members who have been sitting examinations in recent weeks. Special congratulations also to all those who have achieved some particular goals. Congratulations to Eileen Neill whose artwork was displayed in the St Patrick's Centre as part of the Blackwater Integrated College GCSE exhibition in June. Well done to Tierna Kelly who was part of the Down High Seven a Side football team which won the Northern Ireland Schools Championship. Tierna is the youngest in the team and in the year at school one year below most of the other players. Congratulations also to Adam Moffett who in June represented Ulster at the Special Olympics in Limerick and won a gold medal in Bocce. Adam only took this sport up recently and trained very hard to win the gold medal. (Bocce is a version of bowls or boules).

Sunday School

Thank you to everyone who supported the denominational Sunday School Service and Exhibition at Ballyclare on Friday, 6th June. There was a good attendance from Downpatrick, Ballee and Clough and a vast amount of truly wonderful work entered by the children of all three Sunday Schools. The three Sunday Schools all won a good number of prizes – Clough 18; Ballee 5; Downpatrick 18 - including two of the special prizes - Eileen Neill won the Michael Richardson Award for Best Freehand Painting or Drawing (actually the fourth year in succession which Eileen has won this prize for art, which underlines her great ability as an artist) and Louise Steers won the Domestic Mission Award for Best Denominational Entry (on the history of the NSPCI). But everyone did very well indeed, our Sunday Schools did exceptionally well.

At the time of writing the Children's Day at Clough has still to take place but the Children's Days at Ballee and Downpatrick have both already been held and both were excellent. The children and young people all conducted the worship very effectively. Prizes, both for work in the Sunday School Exhibition and for attendance, were distributed to all the members. There was an excellent attendance at both services and gifts were distributed to all the men present for Fathers' Day. At Ballee Ross Kelly, who led the service, presented a cheque for £300 for the Moderator's Appeal for the charity Water Aid. This was made up of £130 collected by the Sunday School from serving tea after the service on the first Sunday of the month plus the collection on the day of the Children's Day. At Downpatrick the collection was for the Alzheimer's Society and, including over £300 raised by the Beetle Drive earlier in the year, the Sunday School has now raised around £500 for this charity. Well done to everybody including the teachers and helpers for all their work over the year.
