From the Minister:

We had a very successful visit of the Attorney General to Clough to deliver his lecture on the Clough case of 1836 on Wednesday, 24th May. There was a very good attendance of close to one hundred people, everyone was made very welcome and many people stayed in the hall for refreshments after the meeting. welcomed people from many different churches, from the Presbyterian Historical Society, the Lecale and Downe Historical Society and the Irish Legal History Society and many other quarters. Professor M.A. Stewart made the journey from Edinburgh to be here. Thank you to everyone who helped to make for such a successful evening.

We have a number of special events coming up over the summer and these are all listed in this Calendar. We also will again be having joint services in July and August at 10.30 am at each church in turn. These are all listed including the visit of Godshandiwork Puppets to Clough on 2nd July. It is two years since we first welcomed them and everyone will remember what a splendid occasion it was last time. It is something that will be enjoyed by everyone, young and old alike.

We also will have another Afternoon Tea party for the three churches at the Lakeside Inn on Saturday, 8th July at 2.00 pm. This was very successful last

Following the Attorney General's lecture a number of people have asked me about different aspects of the history of the denomination, many of which were alluded to in the lecture. By popular demand therefore (honestly) I will look at some of these issues over the summer at the joint services and at the same time try and explain why – or if - these issues still have any relevance to us today. So these will be, in order: the first subscription controversy of the early eighteenth century - where does authority lie? (23rd July); the second subscription controversy of the early nineteenth century - what are the limits of freedom? (30th July): Dissenters Chapels Act – legislation to protect our property (6th August); the 'third' subscription controversy of the mid-nineteenth century – Non-Subscribers contest the parameters of faith (13th August). I will try and bring in the local side to these stories and consider how they fit in with the modern world.
