From the Minister:

As we have done over the last few years we will be having a joint service at each church in turn at 10.30 am over the months of July and August. The full list of the services can be found in the Calendar.

Last year we spent some time over summer looking at different aspects of the history of denomination and to follow that this year we will look at some of the personalities who famous associated with our denomination in Ireland. In "Pioneers of Our Faith" we look in turn at some of the most prominent thinkers and personalities who helped develop our denomination and its ethos. These will be, in turn, John Abernethy, Samuel Haliday, Kirkpatrick, James Henry Montgomery, and David Maginnis. Of these the least famous is the local born David Maginnis who deserves to be better known. All were remarkable characters in their own right but I hope the talks will not be dry historical narratives. They will include, for instance, tales of controversy; travels around Europe at a time when this was rare, dangerous and expensive; missing diaries believed to be secretly kept under lock and key; a book thought to be lost for 180 years and discovered by the present writer; five hour sermons given to appreciative audiences (not to be repeated this year); and the tale of theological exploration expanding our appreciation of the divine.

Also over summer we will be having a Praise and Favourite Hymns service on Sunday, 19th August which will also include other special music. We will need suggestions for the hymns to be sung at the service so please pass them on.

As a denomination we were very sad to lose the Rev Sam Peden who died in May. Our deepest sympathy goes to Sam's family. Among other churches Sam was minister of Rademon and we wish Dr Heather Walker well as she is ordained as the new minister there on 23rd June.
