While people were celebrating Easter all across the world the Christian community in Sri Lanka suffered a terrible attack as they met for worship with over 250 people being killed in churches and in hotels in another unbelievable act of violence directed at people engaged in prayer. This is just the latest act of this nature that we have seen in the world. In Sri Lanka it is particularly heart breaking given the vicious civil war that had seen tens of thousands of people being killed over some years but which seemed to have drawn to a close and ushered in a better period of peace and security for that country. Our prayers are with the people of Sri Lanka as they move forward.
