Yalda Shams is one of the few girls who received an education while the Taliban governed Afghanistan. She cut off her hair, dressed in boys' clothes and kept quiet. Now there are 6,000 girls at her school in Herat. During the time when they could not got to school, almost their only entertainment came from copies of the Rainbow magazine, which was brightly coloured and full of uplifting stories. It was produced by the Sanayee Development Foundation, which contributes to reconciliation and peace-building in Afghanistan and neighbouring Pakistan. Now the magazine is emphasising practical steps to build a peaceful country.

Do you find the size of a problem of world poverty daunting? It's easy to feel there's nothing you can do that will make a difference. But to change the life of one person is worthwhile. It cost about 15 cents to produce each copy of Rainbow. Christian Aid...helped pay the Foundation to buy a better printing press.
