#### **NSPCI Roll of Honour**

This year is the centenary of the end of the First World War. One of the projects I am currently working on involves producing a full Roll of Honour of all the men and women of the denomination in Ireland who served in the First World War. A Roll of Honour was begun during the First World War but never continued past February 1916 so my task is to extend this Roll to cover the whole of the Great War. This is a considerable undertaking because so many more people joined up later in the war and a lot more lives were lost from the battle of the Somme onwards. The project has been given funding by the John Alexander Bright Memorial Fund and to mark publication we will have a special service of dedication 18<sup>th</sup> Downpatrick on Sunday, November at 3.00 pm, that is the Sunday after Remembrance Sunday. This will be a unique occasion to remember the contribution of members of our churches to which everyone will invited. If anyone has information about anyone in the denomination who served in the Great War please do still let me know.
